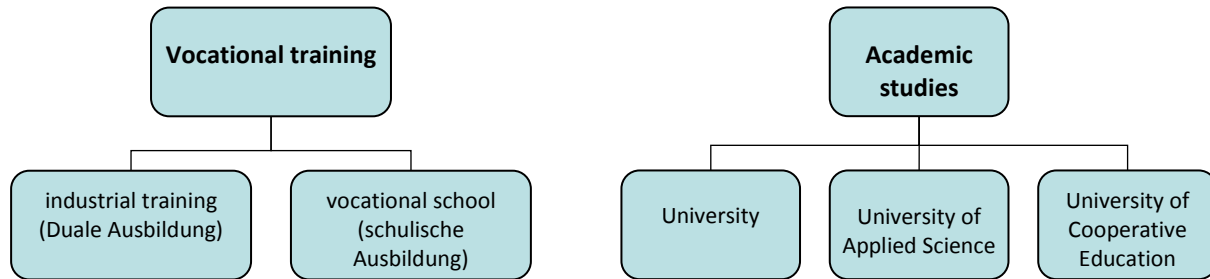


M 3.3f How to continue after school? Vocational training or academic studies?

You have completed school and would like to learn a profession. In order to obtain a professional qualification in Saxony, you may start a vocational training („Ausbildung“) or academic studies („Studium“).



Basics	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In Germany there are specific schools for vocational education, so called „berufsbildende Schulen“ (vocational schools) • A common form of vocational training is the industrial training („duale Ausbildung“). You learn within a company and in a school. This training is highly practical. During a industrial training you earn money („Ausbildungsvergütung“). • During the schulische Ausbildung you learn in a school only. It involves more theory and less practical training. You do not earn money. Often, you may have to pay a school fee. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In Germany, you may obtain an academic degree at a University (Universität), University of applied science (Fachhochschule) or at a University of Cooperative Education (“Berufsakademie”). These institutions are called Hochschulen. In Saxony you do not need to pay study fees. However, you will have to finance your living and study materials such as books. • During studies at a Universität you acquire mostly theoretical knowledge. • At a Fachhochschule you gain theoretical knowledge and practical experience. • Studying at a Berufsakademie is done whilst you work in a job.
Prerequisites / Conditions	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Usually, a school leaving certificate after 9 or 10 years is expected for vocational training. • We recommend German language skills on level B2. • For an industrial training often you do not need recognition of your school leaving certificate. You apply directly at the company. • For a vocational training at a vocational school you apply at the school. Often, a recognition of your school leaving certificate is required. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For academic studies you usually need a school leaving certificate after 12 years. • Each Hochschule may define additional entry requirements. Therefore, it is important to get information from the Hochschule directly. Search their websites and also get counselling from the counselling services. • Usually, for academic studies in German you need German language skills on level C1.
